


Investigation

Title 18 U.S.C. §3154(1) states that the officer will:

Collect, verify, and report to the judicial officer, prior to the pretrial release hearing, information pertaining to the pretrial release of each individual charged with an offense, including information relating to any danger that the release of such person may pose to any other person or the community, and, where appropriate, include a recommendation as to whether such individual should be released or detained and, if release is recommended, recommend appropriate conditions of release.¹

Supervision

The purpose of supervision planning is to create an evolving, individualized outcome-based plan of action to manage risk and monitor the defendant's compliance with the conditions of release. The desired outcome in all cases is the successful completion of the term of supervision during which the defendant commits no new crimes, appears in court for all scheduled hearings, and complies with all other conditions of release.²
